In addition to project teams, this position will supervise at least one full-time subordinate position and manage a community planning advisory committee composed of community volunteers. To that end, the Planner V will review work productions and performance, effectively resolve problems as they arise, look for training and development opportunities, and practice good personnel relations.

Other position accountabilities may include supervision of and/or drafting legislation, codes, or rules; managing the process for environmental impact statements (EIS) as the accepting authority; and work in support of the Coastal Zone Management (CZM) Program, the Capital Improvement Program (CIP), or other related programs or projects administered by the Planning Department.
